In the wake of the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, law firms across the United States are making an effort to help, from providing pro bono legal assistance to fundraising and donating. *Law360* recently featured some of the most recent efforts by the legal community responding to the pandemic, including Katten's role serving as a lead firm for a remote legal clinic launched by the Chicago Lawyers Committee for Civil Rights.
