

## Karen Artz Ash Talks to *Managing IP* About Impact of Ruth Bader Ginsburg's Legacy

In a recent article in *Managing IP*, co-chair and partner of the Intellectual Property practice, Karen Artz Ash, reflects on Supreme Court Justice, Ruth Bader Ginsburg's, legacy following her recent passing, and the progress of gender equality within the legal profession.

Karen explained how Ruth Bader Ginsburg made an effort to talk, in particular, to the women mediators and volunteers about how women need to make more of an effort to be better, smarter and more capable to receive the same recognition as men.

The article in *Managing IP* describes all the ways in which Ruth Bader Ginsburg inspired and influenced women in intellectual property law, as she fought for gender and other forms of equality throughout her lifetime.
