



Partner Roger Furey Profiled in Law360 Q&A

Roger Furey, managing partner for the Washington, D.C. office and a partner in the Intellectual Property practice, was featured in a Law360 Q&A. He spoke of developing his own style as a litigator and how *UsedSoft v. Oracle* has changed software licensing in Europe. Mr. Furey also discussed how Lanham Act litigation has become too expensive for most trademark owners, suggesting, “[W]e need a streamlined version of the federal court litigation process to allow us to get to a final decision from a judge sooner. Reforms in this area would result in significant cost savings for our clients, which is always our goal.
