The UK Financial Conduct Authority (FCA) recently published two consultations: CP25/14 on stablecoin issuance and cryptoasset custody (CP25/14), and CP25/15 on prudential requirements for cryptoasset firms (CP25/15, and together with CP25/14, the Consultations). The Consultations are the latest milestone in the

On 19 June, the <u>UK Data Use and Access Bill</u> (DUA Bill) finally received Royal Assent and passed into law as the Data Use and Access Act 2025 (DUA Act). Government Consultation on the Introduction of Mandatory Ethnicity and Disability Pay Gap Reporting Now Open

The UK government recently launched a <u>consultation</u> on introducing *mandatory* ethnicity and disability pay gap reporting for certain employers. The consultation closed on 10 June 2025 and it applied to 'large employers' and 'large public bodies' who are defined as those with 250 or more employees. The responses to the consultation will be used to inform the government's drafting of the proposed Equality (Race and Disability) Bill and ensure that the legislation gives employers a clear framework on what is required of them. <u>Read about the key proposals</u> <u>discussed</u>.
